#### Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS)

- 1991 Survey developed by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)
- Collection of data organized by the CDC in conjunction with state, tribal and local education/health agencies
- Data used nationally and locally to:
  - √ Assess trends in priority health risk behaviors among middle and high school aged
    youth
  - ✓ Evaluate the impact of broad school and community interventions at national, state, and local levels
- Uses in NH
  - √ Collecting local and CDC sample
  - √ Enabling schools and communities to understand risks and health behaviors of area
    youth
  - √ Developing programs or policies to reduce risk and promote health
  - ✓ Monitoring whether or not health outcomes among youth are improving or deteriorating





#### What the YRBS Is and Is Not


- It is **valid and reliable**. It has been tested multiple times. Findings are consistent with other survey findings.
- It is a **tool** and can be used for **positive changes**, rather than adding negativity to the community's reputation.
- Data reflects the community perceptions and behaviors; the school is simply a place where it is administered.
- It is **not** a "report card" of the school.






# Windham High School 2019 YRBS Data

Responses by Sex




■ Female ■ Male

Responses by Grade


















## Substance use and mental health issues often occur together


- Substance use can be a form of self-medication for existing conditions



## Shared Risk and Protective Factors

- Anxiety and depression, substance use, and other risk/problem behavior (violence, high risk sex) have a number of shared risk and protective factors
- Risk factors increase likelihood of problem behavior
- Protective factors increase likelihood of overcoming challenges and avoiding problem behavior (as well as do better in school and in life)
- Risk and protective factors exist in multiple domains: individual/peer, family, school, community

#### Protective Factors


(those measured in YRBS)

- Academic achievement/high grade point average
- Perception of Risk
- Peer Disapproval
- Parental disapproval of problem behavior
- Positive family management
- Parent interest in school/activities
- Connectedness to school feeling safe
- Positive norms






High GPA: A's and B's




















































#### Risk and Protective Factors for Mental Health and Substance Use

- Risk Factors
  - Adverse Childhood Experiences
    - experiencing sexual violence
    - family violence
  - Living with a person with a substance use disorder
  - Early substance use
  - Family conflict
  - Poor attachment with parents
  - Easy access





#### Sexual Violence - Windham High School



- 9.1% = 86
- 4.5 % = 43
- 3.6% = 34
- Sexual Violence 12 months
- Ever-Forced to have sexual intercourse
- Unwanted advances due to another's drinking -12months









- Either parent/adult in family been in jail or prison










Early First Use – Before age 13 - New Hampshire






